Maple syrup: An untapped industry?

LEXINGTON, Kv. — Kentucky's forests, traditionally valued for their timber and recreation, could soon become a source of sweet economic opportunity, according to a new study conducted by researchers at the University of Kentucky's Martin-Gatton College of Agriculture, Food and Environment (CAFÉ).

The study, "Economic Impacts of Maple Syrup Production in Kentucky: Input-Output Analysis," published in Forest Policy and Economics, shows that maple syrup production has the potential to significantly boost local economies across Kentucky by creating jobs. supporting rural businesses and increasing tax revenues.

Supported by the Natural Resources Conservation Service of the U.S. Department of Agriculture, the study estimates that statewide maple syrup production has the capacity to circulate up to \$25 million each year, create more than 1,300 jobs and contribute roughly \$1.6 million in taxes once the sector reaches its upper projected potential.

Maple syrup, long associated with New England states and Canada, is made by collecting sap from maple trees, primarily sugar and red maples, and boiling it down into syrup. While the industry has thrived in northern regions for centuries, this study highlights the untapped economic potential of maple syrup production in Kentucky, thanks to state's favorable climate

and abundant maple trees.

"Kentucky sits at the southern edge of traditional maple syrup regions, yet our state has millions of acres of suitable maples that are largely untapped," said Thomas Ochuodho, associate professor of forest economics and policy at UK's Department of Forestry and Natural Resources, the study's principal investigator and co-author. "We wanted to explore what potential economic impacts tapping into this resource could have for our commu-

The multi-institutional research team, which included UK, Purdue University and the U.S. Forest Service, analyzed data on tree density, sap vield, tapping season length

and current market prices. Using those figures, the researchers modeled three levels of production potential — low, medium and high — then ran each scenario through economic impact modeling software to generate potential regional economic impacts, accounting for direct, indirect and induced impacts in an input-output analytical framework.

"Our findings represent a starting point for community discussions and policy considerations." Ochuodho said. "If Kentucky embraces maple syrup production. the benefits could extend beyond economic gains, supporting environmental sustainability and com munity resilience."

These are just a few clever ways to celebrate Father's Day, Families can choose activities that honor fathers and ensure he is feeling all the love.



Approximately 700,000 Kentuckians of all ages experience some degree of hearing loss, and Gov. Andy Beshear and the Kentucky Commission on the Deaf and Hard of Hearing are encouraging people to learn the signs of hearing loss and get their hearing checked. National Better Speech-Language-Hearing Month is recognized in May every year.

"Now is a great time to make an appointment to have a professional check your hearing or a loved one's hearing," Beshear said in a news release. "Don't put it off; it's never too early."

According to the release, it takes the average person about seven years from the time they think they have a hearing loss until they seek treatment. That's because it can happen gradually from aging, loud noises or other causes.

Signs of hearing loss in adults include:

- Difficulty following conversa-
- Difficulty hearing in noisy environments:
- Ringing, roaring or beeping in

one or both ears:

- Failure to respond to spoken
- Muffled hearing:
- Constant frustration with hearing speech and other sounds; and
- Avoidance of conversation.

Other reasons to get your hearing checked, starting at age 50, include a family history of hearing loss and a history of noise exposure. Research shows that hearing loss treated at that age can help slow the onset or progression of dementia.

Any of these signs warrant getting your hearing checked by a health care provider or licensed audiologist to assess the degree of your hearing loss.

treat it and develop a plan to preven further loss.

"Sadly, many people live with hearing loss for years before seeking help, which can have serious consequences," Anita Dowd, executive director of the Commission, said in the release. "Regular hearing evaluations are essential. Untreated hearing loss can impact every part of a person's life, from mental health and job performance to personal relationships and cognitive health, including a higher risk of early dementia."

Dowd also emphasized the importance of protecting hearing at every age, especially among children and teens.

According to the Hearing Loss Association of America, 12.5% of individuals between ages 6 and 19 have measurable hearing loss from unsafe earbud use. The Commission notes that early detection and intervention in this age group are key. Hearing loss in children can lead to delays in speech and language development, affect academic success and hinder social and emotional growth.

"Noise-induced hearing loss is en-

tirely preventable, but we're seeing it more frequently in younger people due to extended exposure to loud sounds," she said, "Parents should pay close attention to how their children use earbuds and headphones. Listening to music and playing video games at high volumes can cause long-term damage. A good rule of thumb: If you can hear what they're listening to through their earbuds, the volume is too loud and could be causing permanent hearing dam-
