Jake Hodge Memorial Scholarship

Mission: The Jake Hodge Memorial Foundation grants educational scholarships to students who display honesty, character and integrity. The foundation rewards students who excel in the classroom and in their chosen field of competition. These students who are singled out for recognition are forever challenged to lead a purpose-driven life and to leave a positive and profound legacy.

Eligibility: Graduating seniors from Kentucky high schools in Crittenden, Lyon, Livingston, Trigg and Caldwell counties. The scholarship also includes seniors who have participated in the JHF Wiffle Ball Tournament. Members of the Kentucky High School Rodeo Association are eligible to apply for the scholarship without regard to race, religion, gender, national origin, or disability. Applications will be ranked using the following priorities: (i) essay reflecting strong character and personal integrity; (ii) recommendations citing attributes such as positive role model, mentor, advocate or leader; (iii) references indicating a team spirit in the classroom, on an athletic field or other extracurricular activity; (iv) students having a grade-point average of (GPA) 2.5 and above and motivated to succeed academically at an institution of higher learning; and (v) weight will be given to those who volunteer their time and stewardship to benefit the Foundation's mission and fundraising efforts, including volunteering at Foundation events such as the JHF Wiffle Ball Tournament.

Members of the Hodge family and all relatives of donors who contribute more than 10 percent annually to the scholarship fund's assets are ineligible to receive a scholarship from the Jake Hodge Memorial Fund. In addition, scholarship committee members, including their spouses, children, adopted children, grandchildren and great-grandchildren, nieces and nephews, are prohibited from applying or receiving any scholarship, grant or financial award from the fund.

Review Committee: Scholarship candidates shall be selected by the Jake Hodge Memorial Scholarship Committee.
